SEOC DFC utilized the following Seven Strategies for Community Level Change to conduct its activities.



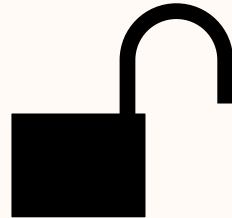
Provide Information

DFC'S Impact

SEOC DFC surveyed youth using the Four Core Measures tool in 2021 (Baseline Needs Assessment) to identify substance use rates and perception of risk / disapproval.

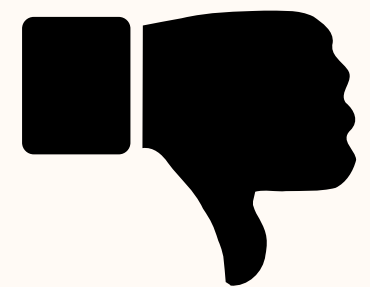
A higher percentage of youth viewed prescriptions as risky in 2021, compared with the baseline data.



Youth reported reduced marijuana and tobacco use in 2021, compared with the baseline needs assessment.



A high percentage of youth in 2021 believed their parents and peers would disapprove of prescription, tobacco, alcohol, and marijuana.
